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#### What is the Associate PI scheme?

An NIHR 6-month in-work training initiative aimed at clinical staff who wish to gain skills and experience in research, and to provide them with formal recognition of the contribution they have made to the study.

#### Who can take part in the scheme?

It is open to healthcare professionals who do not have research as a core part of their role – in Tight K, we have had ANPs, SPRs and consultants participate in the scheme.

### Does it involve a lot of additional work for the PI and the research team?

No, the Associate PI should help to increase capacity by supporting the research team to deliver the trial procedures. In addition, Associate PIs will be supported throughout the 6-month period by the Tight K trial team.

#### Where can I find out more about the scheme?

"My main contribution as Associate PI on Tight K has been in supporting the research team to **identify eligible patients** for the trial. I routinely **reviewed urgent inpatient cases** and **screened elective patients** in the clinic. **Reviewing patients for eligibility during my out-of-hours on-call** further helped to increase the number of patients screened for the study. This was particularly useful given the high rate of variability in operating lists. I was pleased to see that our monthly recruitment rate increased significantly and we topped the leader board in January 2023 as the highest recruiting site that month – great team effort!"
